Security, Education, Water Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH), Community Cohesion and Reconciliation, Environmental Management and Advocacy. We continuously review our institutional needs and internally strengthen our competencies to effectively deliver our organizational inputs into programming. Over the years we have worked in Mandera(Kenya) and Gedo(Somalia).
Our programmatic and operational presence has been driven by community needs and the desire to continuously improve our effectiveness.



The Context and Our Target Population

Our energies are directed to working with the vulnerable and poverty-stricken communities in the Horn of Africa. We target both the rural and urban poor with special attention to pastoralists, agropastoralists and the river-rine farmers who are in dire need of support to guarantee their survival and those of their families. We work in South Central, Somalia characterized by complex security challenges, historical marginalization and recurrent climatic shocks emanating from the effects of climate change. The proximate consequences to the wellbeing of communities are manifested in perennial needs that have been addressed with mixed results. Our challenges are complex, but we have remained steadfast in the pursuit of our vision of just, peaceful and prosperous societies in our target areas of Kenya and Somalia.

WATER SANITATION AND HYGIENE

Meeting the Hygiene and Sanitation Needs for Children in School



Thorn trees stretch in a stubborn thicket for hundreds of miles in every direction of Abduwak District, Somalia. The region is characterized by hot and dry weather most of the year except for some unreliable torrential rains which fall in April and October. Amidst the hot blowing wind and the fog of red sand, Yamyam Primary School is a beacon of optimism in the desolate arid area. Yamyam primary school is a community school located in an IDP camp in Abudwak district, with a population of 130 students and 4 teachers. The school, however, faces a myriad of challenges."Access to safe and clean water has been one of the biggest challenges for this school. Intermittent supply of piped water from the village borehole led to poor hygiene practices among the school population which exposed the students to water-borne diseases.

LIVELIHOODS AND RESILIENCE

Securing Women and Youth Empowerment



Amino Abdullahi Abdi, 46, is an Internally Displaced Person from Bu'ale, Middle Juba now living in the Port town of Kismayo in Southern Somalia. As a newly wedded young girl, Amino owned a small shop in Bu'ale that used to sell household essentials like tealeaves, salt, washing powder, and spices. The money she made from her little shop supplemented her husband's income which allowed them to live a comfortable life. The conflict brought about by local militia prompted Amino and her family to leave home in search of safety. "When we left, I only carried our clothes with us" Amino sadly recalls. "I left all my life back home in Bu'ale"

HUMANITARIAN AID

Providing Life Saving Food



For 51 year old Hawa Kusow, when it rains, it pours. Floods caused by heavy rains swept all her household belongings, destroyed her structures such as the kitchen and submerged her toilet. With nowhere to turn to and no food to feed her household of 10, the resident of Sala village in Northern Mandera, became one of the hundreds of thousands of people left displaced in the aftermath of floods following the heavy October and November 2019 downpour in Kenya and Somalia which resulted to crop and livestock destruction and human displacements.

ADVOCACY AND GOOD GOVERNANCE

Strengthening Alternative Justice System



Elders from the Murulle, Garre, Degodia, Marehan and Corner tribe clans convene in a hall keenly listening, deliberating, discussing and asking questions knowing too well that the fate of people in their communities lies in their hands. In Mandera County, located North Eastern of Kenya, these five clans comprise the majority of the larger Somali tribe with its populace distributed in the larger Mandera County. Although the culture and norms of these tribes are similar, some little deviation exists in their practices. A unifying factor however remains presence of elders who exert heavy influence upon most, if not all aspect of their lives.

EDUCATION

Providing Quality Teaching and Learning Materials



Access to quality education in most parts of Somalia is hindered due to lack of adequate resources such as proper infrastructure, human personnel and books. NAPAD in partnership with Norwegian Church Aid (NCA)

distributed a total of 850 textbooks to 8 Schools in Dollow and Belet Hawa, Districts with the least district-level school developments in Somalia


