# Our Impact 2020

### **SDG 2: Zero Hunger**

- Over **90** hectaires farmland under solar-powered irrigation
- 420 farmers were supported to improve food production through irrigation systems, skill transfer and provision of farm inputs.
- 20 women supported to establish flourishing kitchen gardens in Abudwak
- Approximately 85,937 **IVESTOCK** accessed adequate and lifesaving water in Gedo and Galgadud
- 28,000 people benefitted from humanitarian aid

#### SDG 6 & 13: WASH and Affordable Clean Energy

66,420 persons accessed with affordable safe drinking water in Gedo and Galgadud Regions in Somalia and Mandera Kenya through solarization of 5 community water sources, construction of 4 water tanks and establishment of 4.65-km PVC water pipework.

- **1,230,000 persons** reached through COVID 19 prevention and hygiene promotion.
- 26 hand washing facilities established in institutions to prevent spread of COVID 19
- 2 Solar power community technicians trained to operate and manage the solar water pumping systems established
- 3600 persons benefit from hygiene kits they received
- 54 latrines constructed or rehabilitated

### **SDG 4: Quality Education**

• 7,177 school going children in 22

SChoolS in Gedo region accessed quality basic education

- 2,048 children from 8 schools received learning materials
- 4520 students benefitted from school feeding programme
- 7 teachers received financial incentives

### SDG 16: Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions

- Over 260,000 citizens have information on where and how to access legal Aid services
- 60 Local clan and religious Leaders have the skills to dispense justice through Alternative Justice System

Our challenges are huge, but we have remained steadfast in our pursuit of our vision of just, peaceful and prosperous societies in our target areas of Kenya and Somalia.

The overall goal is to expand NAPAD's integrated community transformational model throughout the target regions in Kenya and Somalia and have a model that can be replicated in other areas with similar contexts. This will be achieved through six strategic priority areas of focus namely:

- I. Improving Water Sanitation and Hygiene standards within the target communities
- 2. Sustainable livelihoods for riverine, pastoral and agro-pastoral communities
- 3. Access to quality and affordable Education
- 4. Governance and Peace-Building
- 5. Climate change adaptation and mitigation
- 6. NAPAD Institution strengthening

NAPAD is adapting to changing contexts affecting the Horn of Africa as with the rest of the world. Impacted by cyclic and devastating climatic events and conflict the horn of Africa is now grappling with the impact of the invasion of the desert locust and COVID 19 Pandemic on livelihoods and food security of the most vulnerable. 
