



### WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE

Duuban village, situated in the Ethiopian Somali state within the Dollo zone's Galaadi district. The To address these challenges and improve access to village is located near the Abudwak district border clean water for domestic and livestock use, NAPAD in Somalia and faces recurrent challenges due to implemented comprehensive interventions under water scarcity challenges but has also severe droughts, resulting in acute water scarcity.

Duuban village and its neighbouring communities These included: heavily relied on the village's borehole as a crucial water source, especially during drought periods. The borehole typically served around 1,000 households but during drought periods, its demand increases significantly, serving up to 2,000 households. Moreover, the borehole also supports migrating communities from Somalia seeking pasture and water for their livestock.

However, this existing borehole infrastructure in Duuban village was inadequate, primarily relying diesel-powered pumps that experienced on disruptions due to fuel shortages. This led to water scarcity, affecting the livelihoods and well-being of

this WASH project.

- Construction of 2 Livestock Watering Troughs: border region of Ethiopia. Ensuring adequate water supply for livestock is a vital asset for the local economy.
- Installation of a Hybrid Solar Water Pumping System, reducing dependency on diesel and ensuring continuous water supply.
- Installation of 200m Distribution Pipes: Enhancing the water distribution network within Duuban village and reaching more households efficiently.

In 2023, NAPAD, in partnership with Terre des the communities, further impacting these drought- As a result of these interventions, the improved 2,000 households in Duuban village, benefitting around 90,000 livestock at the watering trough.






