



# INTRODUCTION

Ethiopia is facing a multitude of ongoing crises, including conflicts, natural disasters, and disease outbreaks. The crises have resulted in significant mass displacement, impacting millions of lives. According to the UN, approximately 3.5 million people are internally displaced persons (IDPs) and 21.4 million are facing urgent humanitarian needs. In addition to conflicts, Ethiopia is also facing extreme weather events, with erratic weather patterns becoming increasingly common. A severe drought, the most severe in four decades, has left communities struggling to cope, pushing them to the edge of survival. Furthermore, recent unprecedented floods in late 2023 have added to these disasters, causing widespread devastation across multiple regions. The country's vulnerability to climatic shocks, coupled with its status as one of the most drought-prone nations globally, highlights the critical need for sustained humanitarian and development support.

In response to these challenges, Nomadic Assistance for Peace and Development (NAPAD) established its presence as an NGO in Ethiopia in 2021.

The year 2023 marked a pivotal phase for NAPAD as we began implementing projects aligned with our 2022-2026 Ethiopia strategic plan.

Our goal was to lay the foundation for sustainable programs that address the pressing needs of the Ethiopian population beginning in the Oromia Region.

We are pleased to present our first NAPAD Ethiopia annual report for the year 2023, highlighting our impactful initiatives and achievements. In 2023, we focused on two pivotal areas: Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH), and Women's Empowerment. 

# NAPAD CRITICAL AREA 1: PROMOTING SOCIAL JUSTICE FOR BENEFICIARIES IN THE TARGET COMMUNITIES IN THE HORN OF AFRICA

## CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE SGDS



## WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE

In 2023, NAPAD, in partnership with Terre des Hommes, successfully implemented a Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) project in Duuban village, situated in the Ethiopian Somali state within the Dollo zone's Galaadi district. The village is located near the Abudwak district border in Somalia and faces recurrent challenges due to severe droughts, resulting in acute water scarcity.

Duuban village and its neighbouring communities heavily relied on the village's borehole as a crucial water source, especially during drought periods. The borehole typically served around 1,000 households but during drought periods, its demand increases significantly, serving up to 2,000 households. Moreover, the borehole also supports migrating communities from Somalia seeking pasture and water for their livestock.

However, this existing borehole infrastructure in Duuban village was inadequate, primarily relying on diesel-powered pumps that experienced disruptions due to fuel shortages. This led to water scarcity, affecting the livelihoods and well-being of

the communities, further impacting these drought-affected households and putting them at risk of conflict and violence, especially at this water point.

To address these challenges and improve access to clean water for domestic and livestock use, NAPAD implemented comprehensive interventions under this WASH project.

### **These included:**

- Construction of 2 Livestock Watering Troughs: Ensuring adequate water supply for livestock is a vital asset for the local economy.
- Installation of a Hybrid Solar Water Pumping System, reducing dependency on diesel and ensuring continuous water supply.
- Installation of 200m Distribution Pipes: Enhancing the water distribution network within Duuban village and reaching more households efficiently.

As a result of these interventions, the improved water infrastructure now serves approximately 2,000 households in Duuban village, benefitting around 90,000 livestock at the watering trough.

This project has not only addressed immediate water scarcity challenges but has also contributed significantly to enhancing livelihoods, promoting resilience, and improving the overall well-being of the communities in the border region of Ethiopia.






Solar Powered Water Pumping System at Duuban Village

## WOMEN ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

Women frequently encounter significant barriers that hinder their progress. These obstacles include illiteracy, limited opportunities, inequitable access to financial resources, and traditional gender social norms that do not support investment in women. Despite advancements in gender equality, these challenges persist, highlighting the urgent need for transformative changes within communities to empower more women.

Recognizing these challenges, NAPAD's initiatives involve financial education programs specifically tailored to women. These programs cover essential topics such as budgeting, saving, entrepreneurship skills, and establishing connections with local microfinance institutions. By imparting essential knowledge and skills, we aim to empower women to make informed financial decisions both in their businesses and personal lives, thus unlocking their full potential and driving sustainable economic growth.

The creation of linkages with local microfinance institutions is to ensure accessible financial products and services that cater to the unique needs of vulnerable rural women.

These offerings include services such as flexible loan and savings options designed to prioritize inclusivity and affordability, promoting economic empowerment among women in marginalized communities.

In 2023, in partnership with Global Giving, we implemented a project in Duuban Village, located in the Ethiopian Somali state within the Dollo zone's Galaadi district near the Abudwak district border in Somalia. This project involved providing solar-powered freezers to five women in the village, enabling them to run their businesses more effectively and sustainably.

The solar system serves as a reliable and sustainable energy source for preserving perishable goods in these remote pastoral areas, where conventional power grids are absent. The women also share the freezers with some community members to preserve their perishable goods, reducing food wastage and ensuring a stable food supply.

By providing the women with the resources needed to sell perishable products, they have stocked up

diverse products, leading to increased income.


Additionally, the project involved training five solar power operators to ensure the proper operation and maintenance of the solar system, ensuring its long-term effectiveness and sustainability.






Training in Operation and Maintenance of the Off grid Solar System
