The Sustainability Model Programme (SMP) is a transformative initiative that aims to enhance organizational capacity and resilience, aligning with the Grand Bargain objective of empowering local responders and promoting localization. Additionally, it is also designed to establish a replicable model that supports the sustainability of equitable and strategic civil society partners.

The SMP has provided NAPAD with a valuable opportunity to strengthen its administrative and organizational capacities, building the resilience needed to better serve our communities.

Sustainability Outcomes

1 Strategy and Organisational Resilience

Increased coordination of NAPAD's annual operations, and resource mobilization capacities towards enhanced sustainability of NAPAD strategic direction and finances.

2 Financial Management

Enhancing the efficiency, and effectiveness of the finance department, including strengthened capacity of staff and the digitization of the finance system.

3 Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability and Learning (MEAL)

Improved efficiency of data/information collection, analysis, reflection, documentation, and storage towards strengthened evidence-based project design and quality assurance.

4 Organisational Development

Strengthening of NAPAD's governance and leadership structures.

Milestones

NAPAD launched a three-year resource mobilization strategy, redefining our approaches and strategies. This initiative engaged all NAPAD staff, leading to improved productivity and efficiency.

4 Staff members achieved certification in Anti-Money Laundering (AML) and Counter-Terrorism Financing (CTF), ensuring NAPAD upholds financial integrity and aligns more closely with global regulatory standards.

NAPAD has strengthened its MEAL framework. This includes updating the NAPAD MEAL manual and standard operating procedures, developing a digital MEAL system, and refining project specific data collection tools. These improvements have been integrated into project monitoring activities, ensuring improved consistency and accuracy.
